THE FORUM

"Health for Women in the 21st Century" is a one day forum for policymakers and the public from both genders who have an interest in the future of women's health. Its purpose is to examine the impact of changing demographics, forecasts for advancements in medical research and health delivery, and other major societal trends impacting women's health. The Forum seeks to stimulate more long-term and visionary thinking in both the health care industry and the public sector, with the common objective to create a preferred and healthier future for women. It is essential that this conference NOT be recognized as a forum for women only.

TREND REPORT

Health for Women in the 21st Century: Key Trends and Forecasts, will be produced by the National Health Council with assistance from the Institute for Alternative Futures. This report consists of demographic analysis, expert interviews and input from major National Health Council voluntary health agency members. It examines key forces impacting women's health in the next century, such as changing demographics, medical advances, information technology, trends in prevention, the genetic revolution, consumer empowerment and new visions for providing access to care.
