### Budget Slash For SGS

On Oct. 4, Dean James E. Tobin issued a newsletter to all department heads notifying them that for the Spring 1969 Semester, the College had seen fit to drop all beginning courses in Accounting,

Business Law, Chemistry, Communications Arts, Contemporary Civilization, English, Geology, Mathematics, Music, Physical Education and all languages.

Included in the letter was a directive stating that there would be no classes scheduled for the afternoon, "nothing whatsoever before 6:20, unless we can arrange to have no day students in the School of General Studies sections."

## WHAT IT MEANS:

The above article outlines the latest & most outrageous attack of this WARFARE-economy gov't. against our lives. The money is around. But as you know 70% of our national budget is spent for the war.

Here at QC most black and Puerto Rican students are concentrated in SGS. Most night students must work during the day and depend on taking classes at night Faculty and college staff now face the real question of job security. And because our generation is more and more counting on college for future jobs, our very livelihoods are at stake!

In essence, the "decision" to drop half of SGS is plainly:

*racist and anti-working class*

## WHAT IS TO BE DONE:

First of all, we have just got to get ourselves together and fight this thing with what ever means necessary. Now. Before it's too late. We've got to demand:

- 
1. Restoration of SGS. But much more: an expansion of the entire university. This means, among other things, admission of 1,000 students to day session with stipends. And that these students be comprised of 60% black and Puerto Rican youth.
  2. Student control of firing and hiring, the library, the cafeteria with decent wages and working conditons for employees, especially caf workers.
  3. An end to all required courses. The immediate inclusion of black, literature and history on all levels of the curriculum. (CCI, 2, etc.)
  4. Forthright knowledge of shady dealings of Ford Foundation with school decentralization and QC.
